#### **From the Pastor**

"Pastor, my son came home from school today and asked me what we believe about dinosaurs."

"Pastor, my daughter came home from school today and asked me what we believe about evolution."

"Pastor, do we believe in angels?"

"Pastor, is it a sin to get divorced?"

You might be surprised at how many similar questions I get.

Sometimes these questions hold deeper meanings and are more personal. "Pastor, do you have time to meet? There's something important I want to talk with you about."

Behind each question is a person with questions about their faith, which have been shaped by their unique understanding of how they see the world. I love to hear them because each one of these questions brings life to my calling because they offer an opportunity to glorify God by speaking the name of Jesus into their lives.

The answers to many of these questions seem to change from time to time due to contemporary knowledge on the subject, knowledge that can challenge our faith on many fronts. The strange thing is that this "contemporary knowledge" has been around since the beginning of humanity. Every generation believes it has surpassed the one before it in wisdom and knowledge to a degree that renders all previous ages primitive and simple.

Today, people are certain that the universe is 14.6 billion years old, that all life evolved from a common ancestor, and that it all came into existence from the "Big Bang."

Today, people are certain that the major world views, religions and the beliefs that came before represent less educated thinking and were based on inferior knowledge. We are advanced; they were backwards. We are moving forward!

The current educated opinion is that we must leave the past behind, throwing the baby out with the bathwater. That which is new must be better because it's based on updated understandings, whether in material goods or accepted human behavior and faith expression.

How this contemporary philosophy sees the world is constantly changing, it is always evolving. Every new revelation changes the lens through which the world sees itself and replaces what came before it. But most people can't see that it has always been this way and that what is believed to be true today is just the next thing to be replaced by what is discovered to be true tomorrow.

As Yul Brynner once said, playing The King of Siam in the movie "The King and I"; "IT IS A PUZZLEMENT".

But it doesn't have to be this way. This month, we celebrate the resurrection of Christ. That is, the singular event in human history that fundamentally changes the way we see the world, God's role in it, and what our future holds. The resurrection of Christ destroys what we thought we know about being human. It bends the laws of nature to God's will, and gives us a lens through which to see the world that is radically different than every Contemporary Perspective that came before it, or that has come since.

Death has been defeated. It is tragic, but it is not final. That God raised Jesus means even more than the fact that he's real; it means that he is concerned about each one of us as individuals and that he is willing to do anything, including die, to save us from ourselves.

It means we matter to him. The resurrection of Christ does not need to accommodate itself to whatever the contemporary thinking or theology; it stands apart from the always-changing opinions of men.

In the beginning was the Word... and He still Is.

## What about Ash Wednesday?

Ash Wednesday will be on March 1 this year. Do you know the symbolism of the day?

- 1. From ancient times, ashes have been used as a symbol of mourning, penitence, grief and humiliation. In his pain and sorrow, Job "sat among the ashes" (Job 2:8). The Old Testament book of Numbers and the New Testament book of Hebrews indicate that ashes were also used for purification (see Numbers 19:17 and Hebrews 9:13).
- 2. Christians have had an old tradition of using ashes made from the palm branches used on the last Palm Sunday. Priests and ministers have often used the ashes to make the sign of the cross on a believer's forehead as part of the Ash Wednesday ceremony.
- 3. The ashes symbolize the Christian's intent to repent of sins, to accept purification from the Lord, and to make a public witness of one's faith in Christ as Lord and Savior.
- 4. Since Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, the ashes symbolize one's intention to deepen his or her spiritual life. Lent is a time for spiritual renewal and growth in dedication and service.
