From the Pastor

I hope the new year has started off well for everyone. Thanks to God, your prayers and some good doctors, my health is much better.

As I sit down to write this article my mind turns to our recent national elections. And I must tell you that I don't often say much about politics and never from the pulpit. However I feel a need to briefly address the subject, and you can take it for what it's worth.

We all know that the relationship of church and state has always been a messy business. There are those who think that the two are one and the same ...However the Bible makes no such affirmation.

There are also those who think that the two are easily separable ...However the Bible makes no such allowance for that belief either. What we believe, particularly concerning matters of right and wrong, of justice and peace, of freedom and authority, should directly relate to how we vote, how leaders rule, and what we expect from our leaders.

What should be the relationship between Christians and political leaders?

My own view is that on the one hand, we should start based upon a clear understanding of human sin. That is to say that leaders are fallible people who are incapable of entirely delivering upon what they promise. The most obvious problem arrives when people, committed to a particular political party or person, will go to great lengths to defend their candidate's strengths while downplaying their weaknesses.

In contrast, they exaggerate their opponent's weaknesses while ignoring their strengths. The popular "conventional wisdom," as Newsweek weekly puts it, is to label all politicians as either "all saint" or "all sinner".

Well, guess what... just like us... they are all sinners.

A Christian should be able to applaud the strengths and the positions of any party while at the same time recognize and denounce any weaknesses or obvious departures from Biblical teaching. And so our role as a Christian is to never be so tied to the machine that we lack in courage to hold them accountable for behavior or positions we disagree with or lack the humility to commend them when they are right.

Having said all of that, I believe that we should be praying daily for our leaders as God's appointed rulers. The Apostle Paul writes to Timothy:

"I urge you, first of all, to pray for all people. Ask God to help them; intercede on their behalf, and give thanks for them. ² Pray this way for kings and all who are in authority so that we can live peaceful and quiet lives marked by godliness and dignity. ³ This is good and pleases God our Savior, ⁴ who wants everyone to be saved and to understand the truth." 1 Timothy 2:1-4 (NLT)

Being a leader of any kind has it's challenges, but our elected leaders at the highest level have been given the difficult roles of protecting the peace of the nation and indeed the world, and they need God's guidance in doing so.

So as we enter into a new chapter in our Nation's Story, I encourage you to pray for President Trump, his family and for all those in leadership, that they would allow God and His Word to guide their decisions, their words and actions so they would be pleasing to God and beneficial to all Americans and to all peoples around the world.

I hope that your Christmas holiday was filled with the warmth of family and friends, as well as wonderful food and fellowship. As we approach the new year, many of our thoughts turn to helping others as you have done. Justin’s first Christmas with us was not very joyous. He came to the Children’s Home one week before Christmas, four years ago. He had been removed from his home due to abuse, and was a repeat runaway with anger issues. He was also failing in school. But he has come to see this as his home and believes it is the best possible place for him.

His grades are now all A's and B's, and he no longer runs away. Through our therapeutic program, he has resolved the anger issues, and he has even earned his learner's permit from the DMV. When I asked him recently what he was most proud of, he replied, "I've matured a lot. Now I get to be a role model to the other kids, and help them like I've been helped."

Most of our children here at the Children's Home come from situations of abuse, abandonment, or neglect. We strive to make sure that our children are not only filled with the joys of the season, but also understand the true meaning as well – the message of Jesus Christ.

It is because of friends like you that we are able to provide the loving home longed for by our children and the extra special memories during this holiday season. And there's nothing more important to remember than the Christmas message as conveyed in Luke 2: 14, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, good will toward men."



Make Some Magnets


You will need:


