From the Pastor

As I began to compose this article I was thinking of all the rain that we've had over the last few months and in my research for Putnam County I came across an interesting story.

In August 1955, over a period of just a few days, twelve inches of rain was dumped on Putnam, Connecticut caused by hurricane Diane. The Quinebaug River runs nearby, which was contained at the time by old earth and stone dams.

Well, the rain was too much for the dams and one by one they burst allowing tons of water to come crashing through the town at speeds of twenty-five miles per hour. Bridges and roads were destroyed, along with one fourth of the town's businesses and homes.

The water poured into a warehouse owned by the Belding Hemingway Magnesium Plant. As the barrels of magnesium came into contact with water, it ignited. The fire department and the rest of the town watched helplessly as barrels exploded, shooting fire 200 feet into the air. The flaming barrels landed on buildings throughout the community and fire spread throughout the town.

Damage to the town ran into the tens of millions, taking years to rebuild.

In spite of the devastation done to this tiny New England town, *not one single person died during the storm*. Putnam, Connecticut was consumed with fire and flood, yet everyone was saved.

When I read about this event, I was reminded of what God promised through the prophet Isaiah...

When you pass through the waters I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze... (Isaiah 43:2)

Isaiah didn't promise that you will be saved from the fire or the flood...he promised that you will be protected in the midst of it. He's saying, in effect, "When you experience circumstances beyond your control, God will protect you and help you get through them."

After a conversation the other day with some folks in the pumpkin patch, I was reminded that some people interpret the devastation as evidence that God was testing them. I don't believe that. The fires and the floods of life are only evidence that we are human. Everyone has problems. Jesus said, "*The rain falls on the just and the unjust.*" (Matthew 5:45)

We all experience tragedy at some time in life. Remember: God is not the source of your problems, he's the solution. He doesn't create the misery in your life, he helps you through it. And during the storm we have his promise...

Do not be afraid, for I am with you. (Isaiah 43:5)

Every season of life brings new opportunities, new challenges, and the occasional storm. Remember, when you face the fire and the flood, that God is with you.

May the Lord bless you as you place your trust only in Him.

Cuba Covenant

Did you know Trinity UMC is supporting the San Antonio de Rio Blanco Church in Cuba? We entered into a sister church relationship with them around 10 years ago and several of our members have been to visit the church. Additionally, Pastor Rene' came to Palatka one year and the District Superintendent of the Havana District of the United Methodist Church in Cuba visited also at a separate time. We are a blessing to the church in Cuba with our prayers, contributions and loving support. The Cuba Conference changes pastoral assignments as the Florida Conference does and the San Antonio de Rio Blanco Church has Pastor Alexeis Velazquez Perez as their current pastor. Trinity has sent contributions which were designated for the church in Cuba twice in 2017. Our total sent is \$2,616.56. We sent \$1,217 in January and \$1,399.56 in September.

Pastor Alexeis wrote the following concerning the money sent in September.

We thank God for his support and collaboration with God's work in Cuba. Today I received by the Western Union the money you deposited yesterday (1269.90 CUC) enough for the salary of the missionaries for a year and the rent of the bus to pick up and take the missions on Sundays to the church and then to their distant homes. I think it will be a lot of bend Decision for all, this Sunday we begin this vision, my brother will be until February of 2018, the rent of omnibus is a

little expensive but necessary to reach the souls that live distant from our church. I will send you some pictures this Sunday to show them to our brothers in the faith. Keep praying for our church, families and ministry. God continue to prosper his life church and families and that the peace of God that surpasses all human understanding reigns in their hearts now and always. Pastor Alexeis.

Our Apportionments

Apportionments are the portion of the Trinity yearly budget which are paid to the Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church for Conference wide expenses as determined by the yearly Annual Conference. Our 2018 Apportionments are determined by adding together the 2016 salary & benefit expenses, operating expenses and program expenses. Those expenses are applied against the “Fair Share Decimal” for our church. The categories which comprise the Apportionments and the “Fair Share Decimal” calculation cost are described at:

In reviewing our expenses in terms of salary & benefits, operating expenses and program expenses, they went up from \$158,555 in 2015 to \$178,097 in 2016. This 12.33% increase is what resulted in the 8.38% increase in apportionments (from \$20,802 to \$22,545) for 2018. The 2016 numbers are the latest numbers that have been finalized in order to run the formulas for the 2018 Apportionments. They are based on the year-end report lines of salary & benefits for all lay employees and clergy, operational items and program items.

Compensation for all lay employees and clergy which totaled \$143,187 include:

- Pastor Salary
- Pastor Pension and Health Insurance Payments
- Pastor Housing Allowance
- Pastor Reimbursable Account
- Secretary, Worship Leader, Youth Ministry Director and Custodian Salary

Operational Items which totaled \$26,631 include:

- Honorarium – Visiting Pastor
- Annual Conference Expense
- Church Utilities
- Facilities Repair & Maintenance
- Tuning & Repair of Pianos
- Grounds Maintenance
- Safety Deposit Box
- Tax Exempt Annual License
- Fire Assessment Fee
- Supplies & Printing
- Postage & Mailing
- Office Equipment Maintenance
- Offering Envelopes
- Kitchen Custodial Supplies
- E-Giving Transaction Expense
- Flowers For Sunday Service

Program costs which totaled \$8,279 include:

- Worship
- Education
- Uprising Student Ministry
- Kids' Klub
- Fall Festival
- Sound System


